About the Author: Kate DiCamillo

Kate DiCamillo was born March 25, 1964, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Her family moved to Florida when she was five years old because Kate suffered from a chronic case of pneumonia and needed to be in a warmer climate. Her mother was a teacher and her dad was a dentist. She graduated from the University of Florida in 1987 with a degree in English and worked in Florida until she moved to Minneapolis at the age of 30. There, she worked at a book warehouse which led to her interest in writing children's books.

Kate wrote her first children's book, <u>Because of Winn-Dixie</u> in the year 2000, which became a 2001 Newbery Honor Book, and a motion picture in 2005. She wrote her second book, <u>The Tiger Rising</u>, in 2001, and her next book, <u>The Tale of Despereaux</u> in 2003, which won the 2004 Newbery Medal and was released as a movie by 20th Century Fox in 2008. She also wrote <u>The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane</u> in 2006, and <u>The Magician's Elephant</u> in 2009. In addition to chapter books, she is also known for her series of Mercy Watson picture books.

Kate currently lives in Minneapolis, Minnesota with her dog, Henry, and continues to write books for both children and adults.

Opal comes up with the idea to throw a party at Gloria Dump's house. Opal needs your help. Write out a list of guests to be invited and create a party invitation. Then write out a grocery list for the party.

Writing Prompts for Chapters 21-26:

Otis is a little wary about going into the back yard for the party. If you were Opal, what would you say to Otis to persuade him to walk around back and join the party?

Just as they started the party, it started to pour. Write about a time when you were in the middle of a special event and it started to pour. Tell about what happened, what you did, and how you felt.

Opal and her dad went looking for Winn-Dixie because they thought he ran away. Write about a time when you or someone you know lost a pet. Were they ever found? If so, where and how.

The book ends with Otis playing his guitar and everybody singing. Pretend you are the author and write about what happens the next day.




